A NATION'S TRIBUTE
11TH NOVEMBER 2018
100 YEARS OF REMEMBRANCE

Trull is playing its part in Battle's Over, an international commemoration marking 100 years since the end of World War I.

Parishioners are invited to join thousands of communities across the country and throughout the world taking part in the tribute to the fallen on November 11th 2018.

The event will also commemorate the huge army of men and women on the home front who underpinned the war effort - keeping the wheels of industry turning and bringing home the harvests.

The commemoration in Trull has been organised by the Parish Council in partnership with All Saints Church, Trull Scout Group and the Trull Parish Archive Group.

It will take place on the King George V playing field on the evening of Sunday November 11th, with an exhibition and refreshments in the Geoff Hewett Pavilion from 4.30pm.

The ceremony will begin at 6.50pm when Trull Parish Council Chairman, Anthony Kent, will read A Nations Tribute.

At 6.55pm local trumpeter Will Lang will sound the Last Post.

At 7pm the WW1 Beacon of Light will be lit by Martin Fouracre, whose great-uncle was amongst the fallen, ably assisted by Trull Scout Group, in a tribute signifying the light of peace that emerged from the darkness of four years of war.

Then at 7.05pm the All Saints Church bell ringers will join over 1,000 churches and cathedrals Ringing Out for Peace.

Trull's involvement in the Great War has been documented by the Parish Archive Group in their publication, *We Will Remember Them*. Copies will be available to buy at the exhibition, which will feature extensive original WW1 memorabilia, much of it loaned by parishioners, extracts from war diaries, photographs of Trull's fallen, replicas of service food and much more. The exhibition will also be open in All Saints Church on Monday 12th November, from
