The Trull Meadow Working Group has met once since the last Parish Council Meeting in March. Following the decision of the Parish Council not to commit to any financial support for the purchase of Trull Meadow, the Working Group meeting discussed how best to proceed and what strategy to adopt with Queens. The Trull Meadow Trustees then held a separate meeting to draft an offer to Queens which was subsequently delivered. A response is awaited. Trull Parish Council would like to thank the TMWG for all of their hard work and determination in this matter.

Canonsgrove Residents

The District Council was directed by the Government to find safe housing for the homeless and elected to take over an empty Hall of Residence at Canonsgrove for up to 60 homeless. Staff were drafted in to run the facility and a number of organisations are providing help. Although the Parish Council were not consulted when the decision was made, they are keeping a close eye on any issues in conjunction with the PCSO and local residents and those that arise are being dealt with promptly.
