Councillor Elected

Anthony Kent has been elected to fill the vacant seat on Trull Parish Council. Mr Kent gained 167 votes in the poll on October 22nd. Barbara O'Connor secured 70 votes. From an electorate of 1,532 there were 94 ballot papers issued at the polling station – a turnout of 6.14%. One ballot paper was rejected for being unmarked or wholly void for uncertainty. The other 143 votes cast were made by post.

Comeytrove Planning

Trull Parish Council has submitted further comments on the amended plans for 2,000 homes on land at Comeytrove/Trull. Members objected to the application and an associated application for demolition of sections of the wall on Honiton Road at a special meeting attended by 29 members of the public. Taunton Deane Borough Council's planning committee will make its decision on the application for the urban extension at a meeting in the Blackbrook sports centre on Wednesday 4th November.

SADMP Hearings

Initial hearing sessions for the Taunton Deane Site Allocations and Development Management Plan (SADMP) have been scheduled for Tuesday 1st and Wednesday 2nd December 2015. These initial hearing sessions will be held to discuss the proposed urban extensions at Comeytrove/Trull and Staplegrove only, further hearing sessions to consider other matters may be arranged in due course. The

hearing sessions will be presided over by Inspector Paul Griffiths BSc (Hons) BArch IHBC at Flook House, Belvedere Road, Taunton and will start at 10am. Highways

Trull Parish Council will look at ways to deter traffic from speeding as it comes into the Parish from the Blagdon Hill direction. It follows the latest data from the SID installation on the Honiton. When the device was mounted to the north of Bradbeers in March/April, it recorded around 1,050 vehicles a day - of them, 81% exceeded 30mph; 11% exceeded 40mph, and 93 exceeded 50mph. The latest data from the SID when mounted to the south of Bradbeers, but still 65m *inside* the 30mph zone, again recorded around 1050 vehicles a day, but their overall speeds were significantly higher - 93% exceeded 30mph; 47% exceeded 40mph, and 954 exceeded 50mph.
