\*Vehicle interference on 17<sup>th</sup> August in Staplehay.

\*The number of drunken individuals regularly walking past on the Honiton road towards Canonsgrove, drinking from cans as they stagger on by.

Regarding the individuals walking and drinking along Honiton Road. We are maintaining regular patrols along Honiton Road and dealing with individuals as necessary. And Cannonsgrove Management are also aware of the issue and are dealing with these individuals on a case by case basis as they receive reports from the community and Police.

\*The volume and more importantly the speed of traffic using Sweethay Lane (several reports)

Regrettably since the introduction of the roadworks many of the diversion routes are seeing an increase in traffic volume and speed. We are aware of the issue and are using targeted patrols regularly along these routes and dealing with driving offences as we find them.

## **Patrols**

The Neighbourhood Policing Team continue to carry out regular, high visibility patrols in Trull, Staplehay and Comeytrove on foot, by car and bike including regular visits to local businesses. Patrols are recorded on our patrol plans for reference and there are regular social media updates.

PCSO Lyndsay has restarted her regular Neighbourhood Engagement surgeries at The Hive Café.

PCSO's Lyndsay and Alex have been security marking bikes in Trull.



## Partnership working

\*\*\*\*\*

We continue to have weekly meetings with YMCA and SW&T to discuss any ongoing issues and concerns and maintain an up to date list of residents at Canonsgrove, as well as having a direct link to the team to discuss other incidents as they arise.

Lisa Rigby holds a Neighbourhood Engagement surgery on site (every two weeks) to engage with residents, deal with any issues and to give appropriate words of advice to those who are reported to be involved in causing ASB.

Lisa also carried out patrols in the village in company with Canonsgrove Manager for YMCA – Pat Collins on Friday 13<sup>th</sup> August, including a visit to The Hive Café, Gaia Garden Deli and Trull Stores and also with the SW&T Rough Sleeping Team on the evening of Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> August.
